Sadly, every year millions of homeless cats are euthanized in shelters across the nation. Spaying - or "fixing" - your female cat is the only fool-proof population control. It can also add up to five years to her life and reduce the risk of cancer and other diseases.

When she's in heat and outdoors, she actively searches for male cats to mate with, exposing her to traffic and other dangerous encounters.

Forced to remain inside, away from potential mates, her anxiety can result in howling and urine spraying, which no one likes. There, she will continue to go into heat every few weeks until mated (or spayed).
